



Kingdom Come

by Mark Waid and Alex Ross

Themes: * Justice * Change
* Good vs. Evil * Dystopia

They are here, they are here! The new graphic novel that we ordered are now on display and ready for check out. If this book is any indication of how good the rest of them are, you are all in for a treat. Waid and Ross' graphic novel was originally published in 1996. This is a work whose name gets tossed around as a classic in the DC Universe. I thought it'd be a little outdated, maybe even irrelevant with the rise of modern fandoms. However, this story of Superman's retirement shocked me with its pertinence. Superman becomes replaced by the vigilante Magog, who represents the new wave of violent justice. Metropolis, the same city that elected him as their savior, casts him aside. Heroes like Wonder Woman, The Green Lantern, and many others follow suit and become displaced by a new, vicious band of vigilantes. It isn't until the world faces destruction that the heroes of yesteryear rise once again. I was wrong to think this was outdated, just as the people of the comic thought the same of Superman. 
