CR-05 - Goals and Outcomes

Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)

The Program Year (PY) 2025 Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) reflects the City of Upland's efforts to coordinate funding to deliver comprehensive community development projects and services to its citizens. This report summarizes how federal funds were invested from July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026, to meet the goals and objectives identified in the 2025-2030 Consolidated Plan and Substantial Amendment to the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan that accounts for the City's allocation of CDBG-CV funds (also referred to as CARES Act Funds). The City's partnership with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has enabled significant investment in the neighborhoods. The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds received from HUD have provided infrastructure improvements, façade rehabilitation, homeless prevention, neighborhood preservation, fair housing services, economic opportunities, and public services.

The PY 2025 CAPER reflects results from the first year of the 2025-2030 Consolidated Plan. The Consolidated Plan is a comprehensive document that describes the City's housing market conditions, identifies the need for affordable housing and community development and provides strategies to address the needs over a five-year period. The Consolidated Plan provides vision for community development and housing actions with the primary goals of also providing economic development opportunities, business enhancement through façade rehabilitation, improve neighborhoods, improve public facilities and infrastructure, provide public services for low-income residents, prevent and eliminate homelessness, housing preservation, and ensure equal access to housing opportunities.

The following narratives evaluate the proposed goals and objectives of each activity listed in the PY 2025 Annual Action Plan and summarized the accomplishments achieved during PY 2025.

The summary of CDBG resources includes \$612,647 in entitlement for PY 2025-26 and \$19,184.45 of unspent fund from the previous year to support CDBG Capital Improvement activities.

COVID-19 Allocations, Program Years 2020-2026

Under the CARES Act, HUD provided special allocations of CDBG funds to the City of Upland. In total, the City received \$873,743 of CDBG-CV funds to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. The City and its nonprofit partners used these funds to address health, housing, and safety needs of Upland residents. HUD distributed the funding to CDBG entitlement jurisdictions through two formula based allocations: CDBG-CV and CDBG-CV3. The City expended approximately 99% of its allocation during Program Years 2021 through 2024 and spent the remaining balance by the June 24, 2026, expenditure deadline.

During the development of the 2020-2030 Consolidated Plan, a set of five priority needs were identified.

Priority 1	Expand Access to Affordable Housing
Priority 2	Improve Public Infrastructure and Public Facilities
Priority 3	Public Services for low-income families, including Homeless Services
Priority 4	Foster Economic Development Opportunity
Priority 5	Fair Housing

During the PY 2025-26 (July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026) the City expended approximately \$345,955.85 in CDBG entitlement funds, and the remaining \$8,913.33 in CDBG-CV funds to address the priority needs outlined in the City's Consolidated Plan.

To address barriers affecting underserved populations and improve service delivery, the City of Upland actively participates in the San Bernardino County's Continuum of Care (CoC) and the Interagency Council on Homelessness. The regional partnerships coordinate efforts to address homelessness and advance the goals of the CoC's 10-Year Strategy to End Homelessness. The City also supports the Housing Authority of the County of San Bernardino (HACSB), the country's largest provider of affordable.

The City regularly evaluates the effectiveness of its Consolidated Plan and monitors its subrecipients to ensure that the CDBG program remains aligned with its strategic goals. Adjustments are made when necessary to respond to changing community needs and improve program performance.

During the program year the City approved a substantial amendment to its PY 2023-24 and PY 2025-26 HUD Annual Action Plans to reallocate unspent CDBG funds to eligible capital improvement projects. The amendments underwent the required citizen participation process, were formally approved by the City Council, and received HUD approval. Narrative

The City reports the racial and ethnic composition of persons and households assisted through CDBG-funded activities using accomplishment data entered into HUD's Integrated Disbursement and Information System (IDIS). During Program Year 2025, CDBG non-housing activities assisted 1,175 persons. Of these beneficiaries, 900, or approximately 76.6%, identified as White; 71 identified as Black or African American; 33 as Asian; 18 as American Indian or Alaska Native; 21 as Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander; and 118 identified with one of the reported multiracial categories.

Of the 1,175 persons assisted through non-housing activities, 433, or approximately 36.9%, identified as Hispanic. The remaining 742 persons were reported as not Hispanic.

For CDBG, this amount consists of \$532,837.74 in prior-year resources and \$16,816.50 in unprogrammed funds, totaling \$549,654.24. When combined with the PY 2025–26 CDBG allocation of \$612,647, total available CDBG resources were \$1,162,301.24. For CDBG-CV and CDBG-CV3, Resources Made Available represents the remaining carryover balance of \$8,913.33 from the City’s original \$873,743 allocation. The City had expended \$864,829.67 through the end of PY 2024–25. The remaining \$8,913.33 was fully expended during PY 2025–26, leaving no remaining balance.

Narrative

The summary of CDBG resources made available in the amount of \$1,162,301.30 includes PY 2025-26 CDBG entitlement of \$612,647 and \$549,654.30 carryover from previous years. During PY 2025-26 CDBG expenditures were in the amount of \$345,954.85. Under the CARES Act, HUD provided special allocations of CDBG funds to the City of Upland. The City received PY 2020 CDBG CV and CDBG CV3 funds in the amount of \$873,743 to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 Pandemic. CDBG CV and CDBG CV3 cumulative expenditures for PY 2020-2024 were fully expended. During PY 2025-26, CDBG CV and CDBG CV3 resources made available in the amount, \$8,913.33, solely from carryover funds, were expended.

Narrative

During FY 2025-26, the City expended CDBG funds consistent with the program’s National Objectives, with 90% supporting activities benefiting low- and moderate-income persons including administration, Fair housing, homelessness prevention, housing preservation and public services were provided citywide, while neighborhood preservation and public infrastructure improvements were concentrated in CDBG eligible low- and moderate-income census tract areas.

Leveraging

Leveraged Resources:

Although the CDBG Program does not require matching funds, the City leverages its federal award with private, state, and local resources. These resources support the City's affordable housing, community development, economic development, and homeless prevention goals.

Local Housing Asset Funds

For FY 2025-26, LMIHAF supported the preservation of the City's 259 affordable housing units.

State HCD HOME Funds

On July 22, 2026, State Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) approved the City's Homeownership Value Limits waiver for existing, stick-built detached homes and condominiums valued up to \$712,500.

CalHOME Funds

During FY 2025-26, the City of Upland assisted 5 families through its First Time Homebuyer Program using State HCD CalHOME funds.

Permanent Local Housing Allocation

The City received State Permanent Local Housing Allocation to support its Rental Acquisition, New Development, and/or Rehabilitation project.

Police Department General Fund

In PY 2025-26, the City U-HOPE program assisted 4 homeless persons and/or persons at risk of homelessness with temporary housing subsidies and support services.

Continuum of Care

San Bernardino County Continuum of Care (CoC) coordinates regional housing and support-service funding. The City did not use Continuum of Care funding during PY 2025-26 but will continue exploring funding opportunities to support its homeless prevention efforts..

HUD HOME/ESG Funding

The City is not a direct recipient of HUD HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) or Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds and is therefore not subject to their matching requirements.

Publicly Owned Lands

During the program year, the City did not identify or use any publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction to address the unmet needs identified in the Consolidated Plan.

Evaluation of the jurisdiction's progress in providing affordable housing, including the number and types of families served, the number of extremely low-income, low-income, moderate-

Affordable housing that has received public subsidies in return for long-term affordability covenants represent a significant component of the City of Upland's affordable housing inventory. Currently, 664 units supported with public subsidies are affordable to households earning less than 80% of the Area Median Income for San Bernardino County.

Discuss the difference between goals and outcomes and problems encountered in meeting these goals.

The City's goal is to preserve affordable housing for low- and moderate-income households with home repairs. In PY 2025-26, the City served 3 households. Performance was affected by construction delays spanning multiple fiscal years, including material shortages and limited worker availability.

Discuss how these outcomes will impact future annual action plans.

The City's housing needs far exceeds available resources. According to the Consolidated Plan's market analysis, more than 59 percent of the City's housing units are over forty years old and require substantial rehabilitation. For this reason, the City will continue to support housing rehabilitation activities to preserve its affordable housing stock over the next few years.

Narrative Information

Although the City is not a direct recipient of HUD HOME funds, it will continue pursuing other resources to expand affordable housing opportunities. The City will also use CDBG funds to support fair housing services, neighborhood preservation, homelessness prevention, public facilities and infrastructure, housing preservation and public services for low-income households.

CR-25 - Homeless and Other Special Needs 91.220(d, e); 91.320(d, e); 91.520(c)

Evaluate the jurisdiction's progress in meeting its specific objectives for reducing and ending homelessness through:

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

Homelessness is addressed regionally through the San Bernardino County Continuum of Care (CoC) also known as the San Bernardino County Homeless Partnership (SBCHP). The partnership includes the San Bernardino County Interagency Council on Homelessness (ICH), the Homeless Provider Network (HPN); and San Bernardino County Office of Homeless Services (OHS). These entities coordinate the planning and implementation of the San Bernardino County Homelessness Action Plan, adopted in September 2019.

Point-In-Time (PIT) Count

HUD requires CoCs to conduct an annual Point-in-Time (PIT) Count of sheltered and unsheltered people experiencing homelessness on a single night in January. The data help identify the trends and needs, evaluate local efforts, and inform funding decisions.

The January 22, 2026, PIT identified 3,178 people experiencing homelessness in San Bernardino County. Including 1,270 sheltered and 2,448 unsheltered individuals. Upland's count totaled 99 people, 71 sheltered and 28 unsheltered persons, an increase of 32 people from 2025.

City of Uplands Homeless Prevention Efforts

The City supports regional homelessness efforts through its participation in the SBCHP. It also used CDBG and PLHA funds for the U-HOPE program, that provides street outreach services and case management services to people experiencing or at risk of homelessness. During PY 2025-26, the program assisted 8 people.

The City will continue participating in the Interagency Council on Homelessness to strengthen regional coordination and expand local capacity to address homelessness.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

The City places a high priority on programs that work to prevent homelessness or rapidly connect homeless individuals with housing and supportive services. prevention resources, emergency voucher programs, and transitional housing. During FY 2025-26 these the following programs assisted a total of 44 Upland residents that were homeless or at risk of becoming homeless:

- **The Police Department General Fund and CDBG Program**
The U-HOPE Program helped Upland residents experiencing or at risk of homelessness obtain temporary shelter and connect with longer-term housing. During FY 2025–26, the program assisted 12 residents.
- **CDBG Program**
CDBG funds supported Foothill Family Shelter's Stepping Stones Program, Pacific Lifeline's Women's Shelter Case Management Program, and Inland Valley Recovery Services. These programs provided transportation, utility assistance, bridge and transitional housing, emergency vouchers, and homelessness prevention services. During FY 2025–26, they assisted 80 Upland

residents experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

The shortage of affordable housing remains a primary cause of homelessness throughout the County, contributing to high housing costs, overcrowding, and substandard living conditions. The City will continue to support the CoC's coordinated system of care, maintain regulations consistent with laws governing emergency shelters and transitional housing, and fund outreach and prevention services that help people experiencing or at risk of homelessness achieve housing stability.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

As an active member of the San Bernardino County CoC and Interagency Council on Homelessness, the City supports the County's Health Committee, which coordinates healthcare and homeless services for people experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

The City promotes 2-1-1 San Bernardino County, a toll-free service connecting residents with housing, healthcare, employment, transportation, education, and other community resources. Through the Police Department's U-HOPE Program, the City also distributes information about housing and supportive services.

City-funded CDBG programs conduct outreach and connect residents, including veterans and other vulnerable populations, with available housing resources. During FY 2025–26, these programs assisted 173 Upland residents experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

Common barriers to housing stability include limited knowledge of available services, lack of transportation, and missing identification needed to obtain public benefits. To address these barriers, the City encourages homeless service providers to participate in San Bernardino County's Homeless Management Information System (HMIS). HMIS enables providers to coordinate services, improve service delivery, track outcomes, and meet reporting requirements.

During PY 2025–26, the City supported Foothill Family Shelter, Pacific Lifeline, and Inland Valley Recovery Services. These organizations provided transitional housing, counseling, case management, financial counseling, and career coaching. Together, they assisted 80 Upland residents experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)**Actions taken to address the needs of public housing.**

The Upland Housing Authority was formed in 1940 under the State of California Housing Authority Law to improve neighborhoods and expand affordable housing opportunities using local, state, and federal resources. Since 2017, the Housing Authority County of San Bernardino (HACSB) has administered Upland's public housing and Housing Choice voucher program. HACSB continues to manage and maintain public housing and provide rental assistance through vouchers and Los Olivos program.

Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership.

HACSB's Resident Advisory Board (RAB) helps review issues affecting residents and program participants. Staff consults with board members on policy changes, resident communications, public hearings, and special events. Membership may include participants from the Term-Limited Lease Assistance, Project Based Voucher, Veterans Affairs Supporting Housing (VASH), and the Tenant-Base Voucher programs.

HACSB also offers homeownership assistance to help eligible participants transition from rental housing to homeownership. The program provides mortgage assistance for up to 15 years for working households and up to 30 years for households that include a person with a disability.

Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs.

No. HACSB is not designated as a troubled housing authority. In fact, HACSB maintains a unique status as a high-performing agency.

CR-35 - Other Actions 91.220(j)-(k); 91.320(i)-(j)

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

California recognizes an adequate housing supply as a matter of statewide importance. Accordingly, the City prepares a Housing Element for review by the California Department of Housing and Community Development. As part of the General Plan, the Housing Element establishes goals, policies, and programs addressing the housing needs of current and future residents at all income levels. On September 23, 2024, the City Council adopted Upland's Sixth-Cycle Housing Element for 2021–2029.

During PY 2025–26, City Ventures Homebuilding, LLC completed 29 townhomes and met the project's 15% affordable housing requirement for low-income, first-time homebuyers. The final income-restricted unit closed in June 2026.

Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The primary barriers to meeting underserved needs include limited funding, high housing costs, and insufficient access to private home-improvement financing.

To address these barriers, the City used \$51,749.44 in CDBG funds for its Emergency Repair Program, which assisted three income-qualified households during PY 2025–26. Because rehabilitating existing homes is a cost-effective way to preserve affordable housing, the City will continue supporting housing preservation programs.

Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 emphasizes preventing childhood lead poisoning through housing-based measures. For homes built before January 1, 1978, the Emergency Repair Program conducts lead-based paint testing and risk assessments and incorporates required safe work practices or abatement into the scope of work in accordance with 24 CFR Part 35.

During PY 2025–26, three assisted units were inspected for lead hazards. No units required lead abatement. The City will continue applying these procedures in future years.

Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

CDBG activities implemented under the 2025–2030 Consolidated Plan and PY 2025–26 Annual Action Plan helped reduce poverty by:

- Expanding and preserving affordable housing for low- and moderate-income households.
- Supporting housing repairs that provide safe and decent living conditions.
- Funding public services for low- and moderate-income residents.

- Promoting fair housing through education, counseling, discrimination prevention, and landlord-tenant mediation.

During PY 2025–26, programs operated by His Hands Food Pantry, IVR Food Security, Inland Valley Recovery Services, Foothill Family Shelter, Pacific Lifeline, U-HOPE, and local fair housing providers assisted 1,157 residents. These programs provided food assistance, homelessness prevention, shelter, recovery services, and other essential support.

The Inland Fair Housing and Mediation Board, a HUD-approved housing counseling agency, also assisted 227 renters, landlords, and homeowners with fair housing services.

Federal and state programs further support households experiencing poverty. These include the Earned Income Tax Credit, Head Start, CalWORKs, CalFresh, and Medi-Cal, which provide employment assistance, food benefits, healthcare, childcare, and financial support. Additional community programs assist residents affected by substance use disorders, domestic violence, and mental health conditions.

Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Upland has a strong, collaborative, service-delivery system supported by City departments and non-profit organizations that provide a broad range of community services. The Development Services Department administers HUD grant programs and oversees the City's housing, community and economic development activities. The City has not identified any institutional barriers that would prevent implementation of its Annual Action Plan.

Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

During PY 2025-26, the city implemented the following actions to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies.

San Bernardino Continuum of Care - Homelessness

The City actively participates in the San Bernardino County Continuum of Care and Interagency Council on Homelessness. Through these partnerships, the City coordinates with regional service providers and supports implementation of the County's strategy to address homelessness.

Housing Authority of the County of San Bernardino – Public Housing

The City supports the Housing of Authority of the County of San Bernardino (HACSB), the largest affordable housing provider. HACSB assist eligible households through affordable housing and rental subsidy programs.

CDBG Program – Housing, Community Development, Economic Development and Homelessness

As a direct recipient of HUD Community Development Block Grant funds, the City prepare a five-year Consolidated Plan establishing its housing, community development, economic development, and homelessness prevention goals. To implement the plan, the City coordinates with municipal departments, non-profit service providers, private organizations, housing developers, and Community Housing Development Organizations.

Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)

HUD's March 3, 2025, interim final rule removed the formal Analysis of Impediments for Fair Housing Choice requirement. However, the City continue addressing the findings of its 2019-2023 Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice as part of its commitment to affirmatively further fair housing.

The City of Upland identified three key barriers: Transit Access, Discrimination against Persons with Disabilities, and Lack of Rental Housing Opportunities in Northern Upland. Specific actions taken to address these impediments include the following:

1. **Transit Access:** Areas north of the 210 Freeway remain underserved by public transit. The City continues to monitor development and coordinate with Omnitrans regarding potential transit expansions.
2. **Discrimination against Persons with Disabilities:** The City contracts with the Inland Fair Housing Mediation Board (IFHMB) to conduct two annual workshops covering fair housing laws, reasonable accommodations and disability-related discrimination. Virtual workshops and educational materials further support community awareness.
3. **Lack of Rental Housing Opportunities in Northern Upland:** Northern Upland has limited affordable rental housing. To expand housing opportunities, the City offers permit-ready accessory dwelling unit (ADU) plans that comply with applicable state building codes and the Upland Municipal Code. The standardized plans support AB 1332, reduce design costs and streamline permitting. The City also continues exploring affordable multifamily housing opportunities through specific plans and infill development projects.

These actions demonstrate the City's continued commitment to removing barriers and expanding fair housing choice.

CR-40 - Monitoring 91.220 and 91.230

Describe the standards and procedures used to monitor activities carried out in furtherance of the plan and used to ensure long-term compliance with requirements of the programs involved, including minority business outreach and the comprehensive planning requirements.

The City of Upland's Development Services Department administers the CDBG program and ensures that subrecipients comply with applicable administrative, financial, and program requirements. Monitoring also helps the City evaluate performance and progress towards its Consolidated Plan objectives.

Sub-Recipient Monitoring

The City monitors subrecipients through report and documentation reviews, risk assessments, on-site visits, telephone calls, written correspondence, and meetings. Staff provides technical assistance to correct deficiencies and improve performance.

Monitoring also addresses potential fraud, waste, mismanagement, and misuse of funds. Subrecipient agreements authorize the City to suspend funding, terminate agreements, or deny reimbursement for performance or compliance deficiencies. When appropriate, staff first works with subrecipients to resolve issues through consultation and technical assistance.

During FY 2025–26, City staff monitored 19 CDBG subrecipients for compliance with federal requirements. Additional monitoring standards are provided in the Monitoring Standards exhibit.

Minority Business Outreach and Comprehensive Planning

The City follows applicable procurement and outreach requirements to promote contracting opportunities for minority- and women-owned businesses. CDBG activities are reviewed for consistency with the Consolidated Plan, Annual Action Plan, and applicable federal requirements.

CAPER Public Participation Efforts

The City provided a 15-day public review and comment period for the CAPER. Public notices were posted or published through the City's website, City Hall, Upland Public Library, and a newspaper of general circulation. Notices included information about accessibility and language assistance consistent with the City's approved Language Access Plan. Public comments and City responses are included in the final CAPER

Monitoring Standards

Project Monitoring

Monitoring of contractors and subrecipient partners of the City of Upland Development Services Department is not just a regulatory process or a fact-finding mission. Rather, it involves effective communication and cooperative, problem-solving relationships between the Development Services Department and its contractors/subrecipients.

Subrecipient

A subrecipient is an organization receiving Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the City of Upland.

The Development Services Department monitors all CDBG programs on an annual or bi-annual basis. Each program requires a written agreement between the grantee and the subrecipient. The requirements demand that the agreement remain in effect throughout the period that the subrecipient has control over funds. In addition, regulations prescribe the provisions that the agreement must contain. These provisions include a statement of work (description of work, budget, and time schedule); records and reports, program income, uniform administrative requirements, other program requirements such as fair housing, labor, displacement, employment opportunities, lead-based paint, debarred contractors, conflict of interest, restrictions for certain resident aliens (as described in 24 CFR Part 49); provisions for Community Housing Development Organizations, religious entities, the Architectural Barriers Act, and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Project Monitoring Process

Each program year, the Department develops a custom monitoring schedule including each contractor / subrecipient comprised of the following monitoring tools:

- Annual Subrecipient Conference / Onsite Technical Assistance Visit
- Desk monitoring
- Quarterly Performance reports
- Onsite program and financial reviews

An appropriate combination of these four (4) items provides a clear and timely picture of each contractor / subrecipient's progress and level of compliance with program regulations.

Bi-Annual Subrecipient Workshop / Onsite Technical Assistance Visits

The Development Services Department staff may provide a bi-annual workshop for subrecipients. At this workshop, City staff review the program reporting requirements and documentation/ recordkeeping standards to foster compliance. For high-risk agencies, an onsite technical assistance meeting may also be necessary to assess the subrecipient's capacity related to recordkeeping, service delivery, and/or accounting systems. These visits are normally conducted in late fall and early spring of each year.

Desk Monitoring

The Development Services Department staff reviews copies of case files to ensure complete and accurate documentation regarding the following items:

- Client eligibility
- Property eligibility
- Appropriate funding levels for the activity
- Compliance with all program requirements (i.e., environmental review)

Performance Reports

The Development Services Department requires performance reports from all subrecipients to assess a project's progress throughout the program year. For capital projects and public service grants, reports are required on a quarterly basis.

Annual Onsite Program and Financial Reviews

The Development Services Department provides annual on-site reviews of all high-risk subrecipients to conduct a complete programmatic and financial monitoring. The Department will conduct on-site monitoring of low and moderate-risk subrecipients on a bi-annual basis.

To prepare for the onsite review, staff:

- Notifies the subrecipient in writing of the date, scope, and focus of the monitoring review.
- Conducts an entrance conference with the project administrator and executive management contact upon arrival that echoes the themes of earlier T.A. discussions with staff.
- Conduct a thorough monitoring of financial and programmatic systems using established monitoring techniques and checklists.
- Conduct an exit conference with agency staff to report the results of the monitoring, hear reactions, and form conclusions.
- Write a detailed letter recapitulating the results of the monitoring visit to document findings and concerns.
- Ensure that all monitoring activities, including relevant correspondence is filed appropriately to comply with recordkeeping requirements.
- Because of the global COVID-19 Pandemic that affected all grantees across the country and funded programs alike, the annual "onsite program and financial reviews" were completed as a remote/desk monitoring.

The Department achieves success through:

- Pre-award screening, risk assessment, and orientation
- Strong written agreements
- Performance standards and program objectives
- Defined monitoring of each subrecipient partner on quarterly, semi-annual, and annual basis.

Monitoring Staff

The Development Services Department staff periodically reports on the progress of each project. The Development Services Department staff has the following monitoring duties:

- Oversee the planning and budgeting process to ensure that projects and programs are consistent with the Consolidated Plan's identified high- and possibly medium-priority objectives and grant requirements. Staff will also provide technical guidance regarding Affirmative Marketing and Fair Housing practices.
- Provide technical guidance with each subrecipient partner regarding: program structure, income requirements, and document compliance. Staff will review the City's monthly expenditure reports. At a minimum, staff will perform quarterly draw downs in HUD's Integrated Disbursement and Information System (IDIS) against the appropriate grant. For IDIS, staff will gather quarterly program statistical reports from the subrecipient partners and update all necessary fields from setup to completion of each project and activity. Regular updating and draws will ensure meeting the CDBG timeliness deadline and HOME's program year deadline. As needed, staff will perform environmental reviews and Davis Bacon monitoring.
- Review the invoices from each subrecipient and ensure timeliness with expenditures.
- Provide technical guidance regarding all housing construction, demolition, and rehabilitation projects ensuring the correct number of units, timeliness in build-out, and approval of payments. For new construction, ensure compliance with all applicable local codes, ordinances, and zoning ordinances at the time of project completion.
- Provide monitoring orientation with all subrecipient partners and establish monitoring visits. The monitoring orientation includes the timing for monitoring visits. Subrecipient partners without problems or significant findings receive annual or semi-annual monitoring visits, while new subrecipients and subrecipients with significant problems or complex projects receive quarterly visits.

Community Based Organizations

Community-Based organizations (CBOs) are funded for a wide variety of CDBG funded activities, especially public services. However, their experience and training in implementing these activities in compliance with applicable statutory and regulatory requirements vary widely.

In addition, some projects are a one-time City effort while others are ongoing activities. Based on this diversity, the City has determined that some of these projects can represent the highest potential for risk, while others represent a very low risk. Therefore, these projects will be candidates for the full range of monitoring tools. Monitoring of CBOs has been augmented by annual onsite technical assistance visits that are provided to every CBO to enhance programmatic compliance. Further, ongoing CBO projects receive annual on-site monitoring visits.

Risk Assessment

A risk designation is made at the beginning of each program year for each CDBG-funded project. The criteria affecting risk designation include:

Low Risk	Continuing subrecipient, single activity, clean prior-year monitoring for same activity, same management and staff, timely and accurate financial and accomplishment reports.
Moderate Risk	All CBOs, subrecipients with multiple activities, near-perfect prior-year monitoring for same activities, some minor staff changes, timely and near perfect financial and accomplishment reports.
High Risk	Single or multiple activities, ineligible activities and costs billed to CDBG in prior year, systemic administrative deficiencies identified in prior or current year, significant staff turnover, and untimely reports.

Consolidated Plan Monitoring

The Development Services Department staff understands that monitoring the Consolidated Plan and the annual activities must be carried out regularly to ensure that statutory and regulatory requirements are met and that, where appropriate, information submitted to HUD is correct and complete.

To ensure that the City's CDBG programs further meets the Consolidated Plan goals, the Development Services Department staff incorporates the Consolidated Plan's strategies, objectives, and activities into its work plan. The Redevelopment Department staff will measure its achievement of Consolidated Plan goals by the same standards used to evaluate all programs and activities.

The Development Services Department staff will appraise its diverse operations and controls and determine whether: risks are identified and reduced; acceptable policies and procedures are followed; established standards are met; resources are used efficiently and economically; and ultimately, its objectives are achieved.

The Development Services Department staff prepares documentation and reports as required by HUD, including the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER). Using a substantial citizen participation and consultation process, the CAPER describes each year's performance regarding Consolidated Plan strategies, objectives, actions, and projects.

Monitoring Strategy

As the lead agency for the CDBG programs, the Development Services Department staff continually refines its monitoring procedures to ensure that each monitoring has a meaningfully positive impact on the overall program and that projects have measurable outcomes. The Development Services Department will publish any proposed significant changes to monitoring standards and procedures in a future Annual Action Plan so that citizens and grant recipients may comment on those changes.

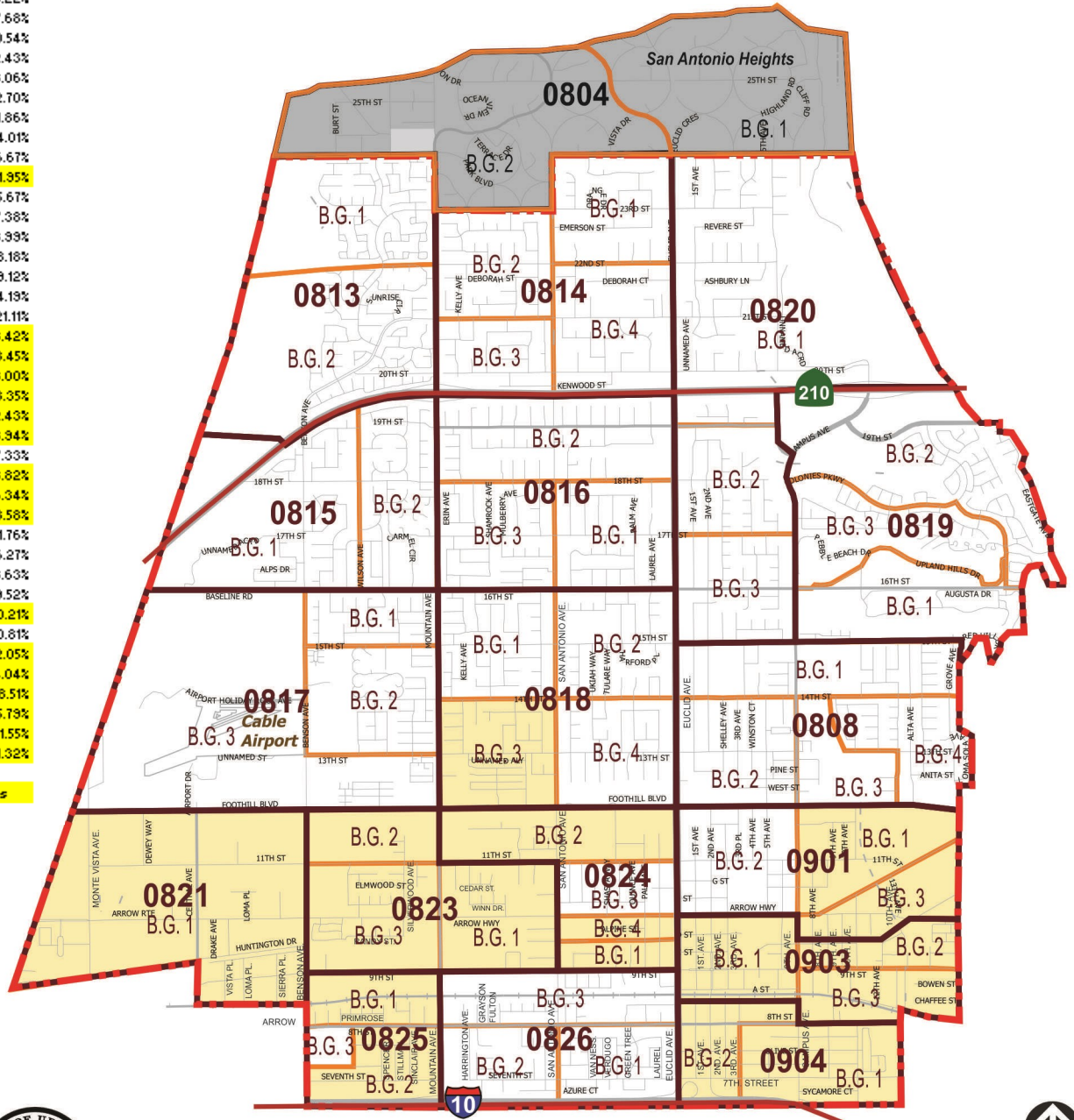
