WHAT'S NEW FOR CALIFORNIA VOTERS

Executive Orders and Legislation

- County must mail a ballot to all active registered voters
- County must provide at least one polling place for every 10,000 voters
- County must provide at least one secure ballot drop box for every 15,000 voters
- County must use a mail ballot tracking system – called “Ballot Trax - Where’s My Ballot”
- County must carry out a voter education campaign


Vote-by-Mail

- Every registered voter in the County to receive a vote-by-mail ballot; mail ballots were delivered to U.S. Postal Service on October 5 for mailing
- Your ballot will be tracked when it is **mailed**, **received** and **counted** through the Secretary of State's "Where's My Ballot" tracking system
- NOTE: County voters will receive two Voter Information Guides - One contains a sample ballot, candidate statements, and local measure information; second is a supplemental guide, and only includes information for countywide Measures J and K.

Did You Know: 70% of SB County voters requested a mail-in ballot for the primaries!

Ballot Drop-off Boxes

- 70 ballot drop boxes; minimum requirement met
- Mail ballot drop-off boxes opened October 6 and will remain open through 8 p.m. on November 3
- Drop-off box locations can be found by using the Mail Ballot Drop Off Locations mapping tool available at www.SBCountyElections.com



Early Vote Sites

- Six early vote sites
- Registrar of Voters office is one of the locations and started serving voters on October 5
- Another 5 locations will open October 26 to October 30 – Hook Community Center in Victorville, Town of Apple Valley Recreation Center, Joshua Tree Community Center, Toyota Arena in Ontario, San Bernardino International Airport Domestic Terminal
- Early vote sites are listed on the www.SBCountyElections.com and in the Voter Information Guide

Polling Places

- Four-day polling place model with 210 polling places; double the number required
- Polling places will be open Saturday, October 31 through Tuesday, November 3
- A complete list of polling places is listed at www.SBCountyElections.com
- Polling place assignments are printed on the back cover of each voter's Voter Information Guide

HOW WE'RE KEEPING VOTERS AND POLL WORKERS SAFE

Safety Measures

- Poll workers will be provided with face masks, face shields, gloves, hand sanitizer, and cleaning supplies
- High-touch surfaces will be cleaned throughout the day
- If a face covering order is in effect, voters without a face mask will be offered one
- Poll workers have been trained to implement social distancing guidance

HOW WE'RE ENSURING THE SECURITY OF YOUR BALLOT

Security Measures

- We have implemented stronger cybersecurity measures and continually evaluate and upgrade our systems
- Ballot drop-off boxes are locked and bolted to concrete
- Poll workers trained on de-escalation techniques
- Coordination with Sheriff's Department and Police Departments

VOTER EDUCATION CAMPAIGN

Voter Education

- Message Platform: “Your Ballot. Vote Safe. Vote Early.”
 - Reinforces message that every ballot counts and matters
 - Voters can participate in the election process safely – by mail, drop box or at polling places – their choice
 - Encourages voting early through their preferred method
- Education Program includes extensive community presentations (33 completed as of today, 30+ more planned and more being scheduled every day through October 24), advertising, social media, PSAs, videos
- Comprehensive media relations to date - newspapers, TV, Radio

Early voting gets off to a busy start

Officials say they can't remember seeing such large crowds on opening day in Inland Empire

By Jennifer Eyer and Brian Palkovich Staff writers

— Election Day is still four weeks away, but Inland Empire voters began showing up to vote Monday. "I don't recall ever having 20 people in line, waiting for the doors to open, on the first day," said Robert Spencer, registrar of voters for Riverside County. Spencer has worked for the office since 2009 and been the registrar since 2016.

— "Usually, there's like five people who want to come in," she said, adding that the line later stretched around the building. Early voting sites opened Monday in Riverside, San Bernardino

and Los Angeles counties. Voters in small ballparks will be available to voters in person over the next few days.

— "The amount of phone calls we're getting in the lead-up to it, it reminds me of when President Barack Obama first ran" in 2008, Spencer said. "They just want to make sure they get votes."


